

About the National Race Amity Institute

The National Race Amity Institute (NRAI), scheduled to open in 2024, is envisioned as a center of research, education, training, youth outreach and the arts, to be housed in the *Be on Edgewood* complex in Atlanta's historic Sweet Auburn district, near the Martin Luther King Jr. National Historical Park and the historic Ebenezer Baptist Church.

Permitting and other preparations have been completed for the construction and renovation of the planned 8,000 squarefoot facility, with 3,000 square feet dedicated for use by the National Race Amity Institute. The *BE on Edgewood* complex is developed by Navmar LLC in conjuction with the City of Atlanta's Invest Atlanta Office, which provided a \$1.45 million grant to assist with the renovation and construction. Yavari Family Enterprises provided additional funding for build-out and furnishing of the National Race Amity Institute.


